Do you know a child with a print disability?

Kids with print disabilities such as learning disabilities like dyslexia, physical disabilities, or low vision or blindness benefit from books in different formats. They can enjoy a collection of accessible library materials for free from CELA, the Centre for Equitable Library Access.

What's in the collection?

- Materials for a range of ages and reading levels, from picture books to novels.
- Fiction: bestsellers, Canadian authors, popular series, classics.
- Non-fiction for inquisitive readers and school projects.
- Magazines in e-text format, including OWL, National Geographic Little Kids, Muse, and more.
- English and French materials.

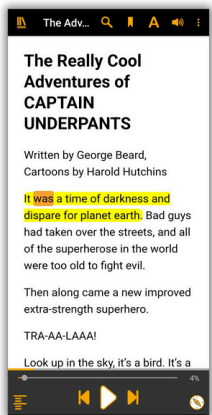


Available formats:

- Audiobooks.
- Braille and printbraille (picture books with braille).
- Accessible ebooks with customizable formatting and read along options.

How do I read books from CELA?

- Download to mobile devices, computers, and Chromebooks using accessible reading apps like Dolphin EasyReader or Voice Dream Reader.
- Assistive technology such as braille displays and DAISY players.
- Get braille books or CDs shipped free to your house.
